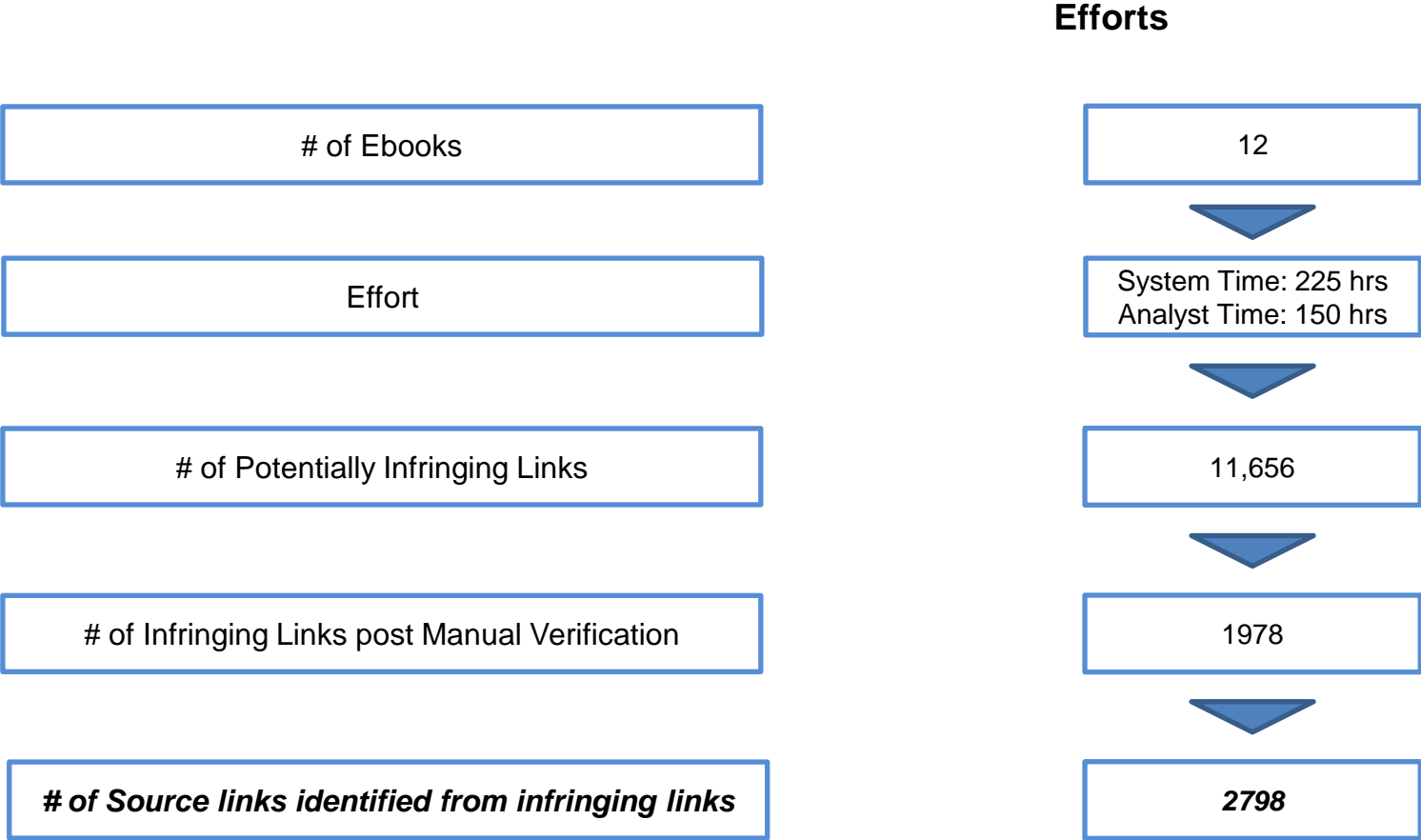

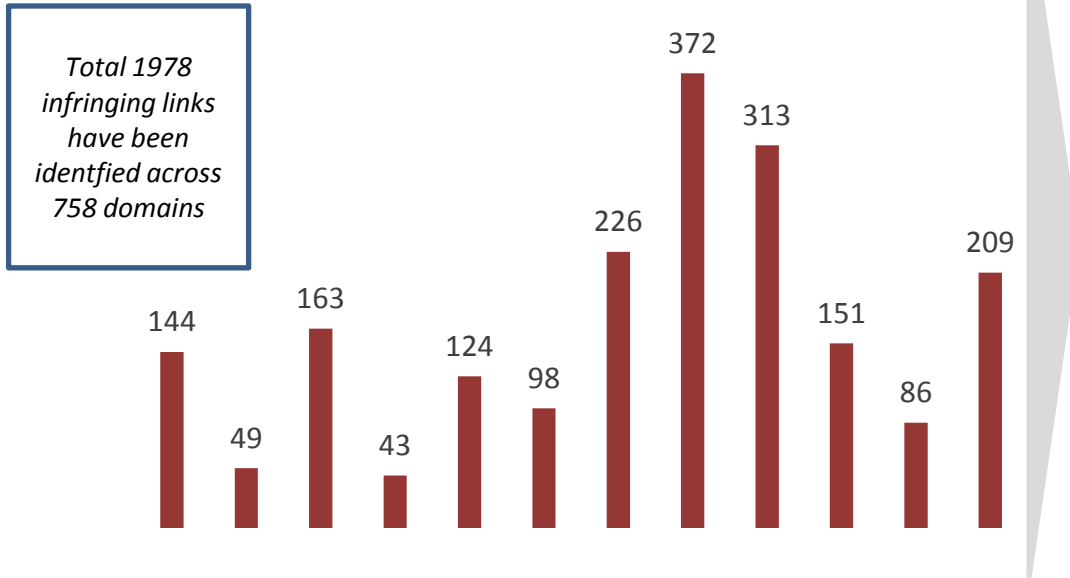
We deployed our system, *MediaScan* for 225 hrs and identified 1978 *infringing links* and 2798 *source links* of 12 *E-Books*



Infringing Link: Any page that provide the URLs to or embed pirated media hosted on other sites.
Source Link: A URL that displays or allows you to download pirated content. These are, typically, specialized websites with high bandwidth.

We have identified >1k infringing webpages from search results; across 758 websites.

Infringing links - by book



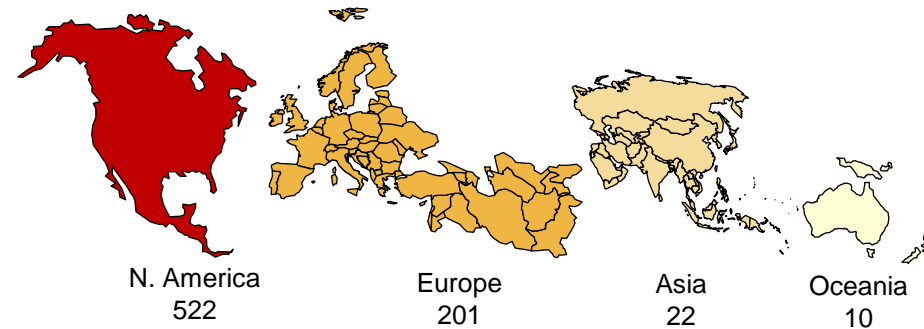

Note1: Infringing link is the page that provide the URLs to or embed pirated media hosted on other sites and appear in search results.

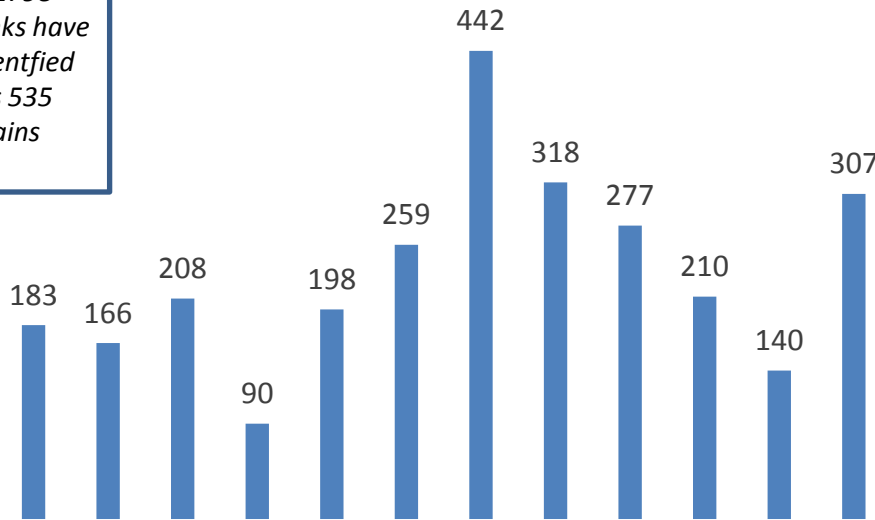
Note2: 9 out of 10 top websites provide content in P2P format.

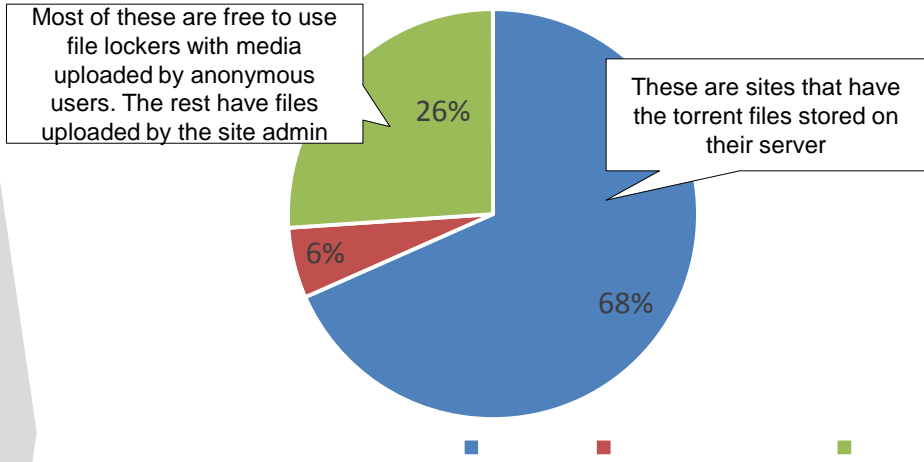
Pirated Content - by recorded platform

Source links - by books

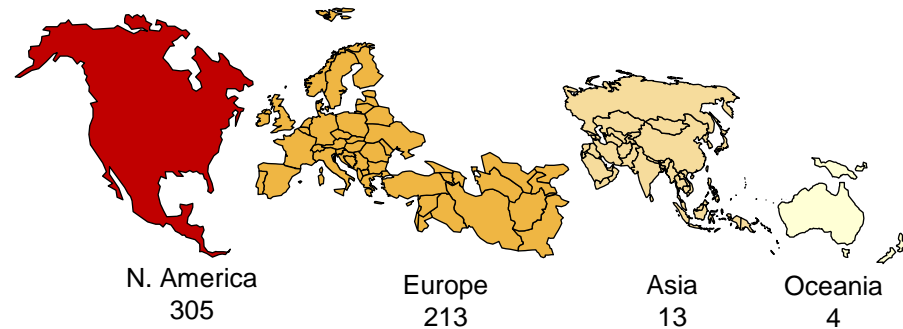

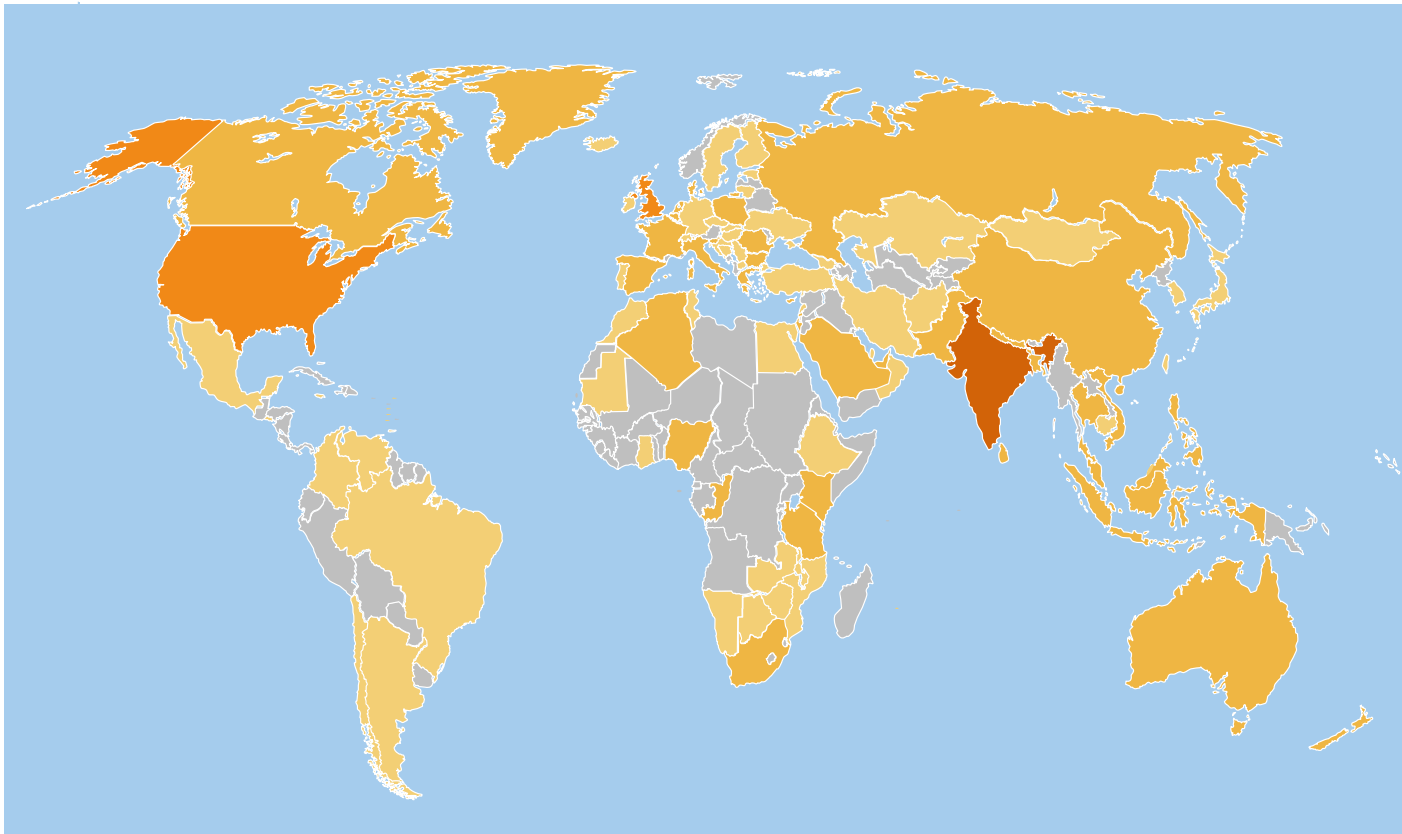

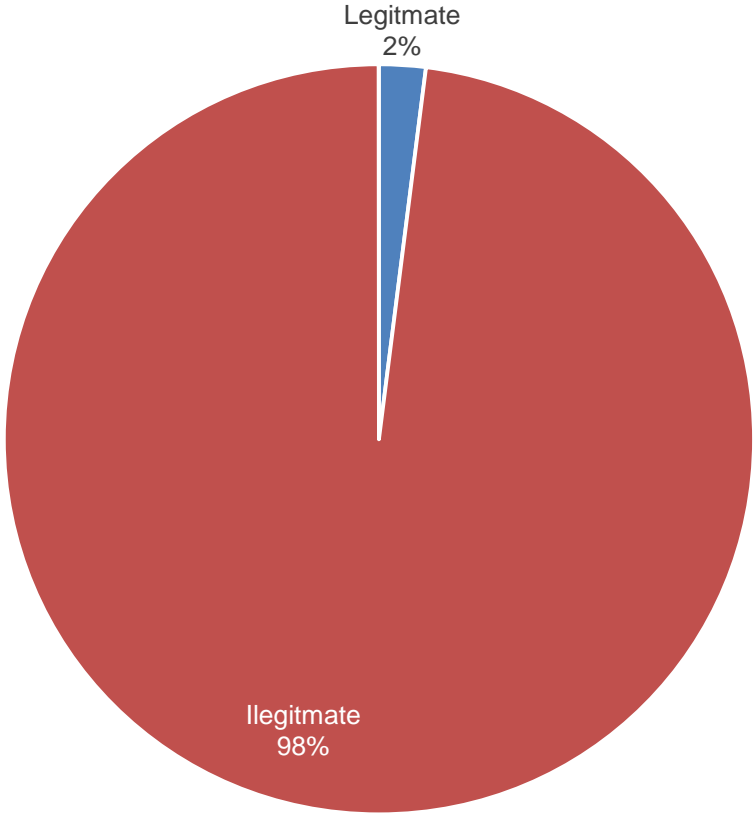

Availibility of Ebooks – Legitimate & Illegitimate

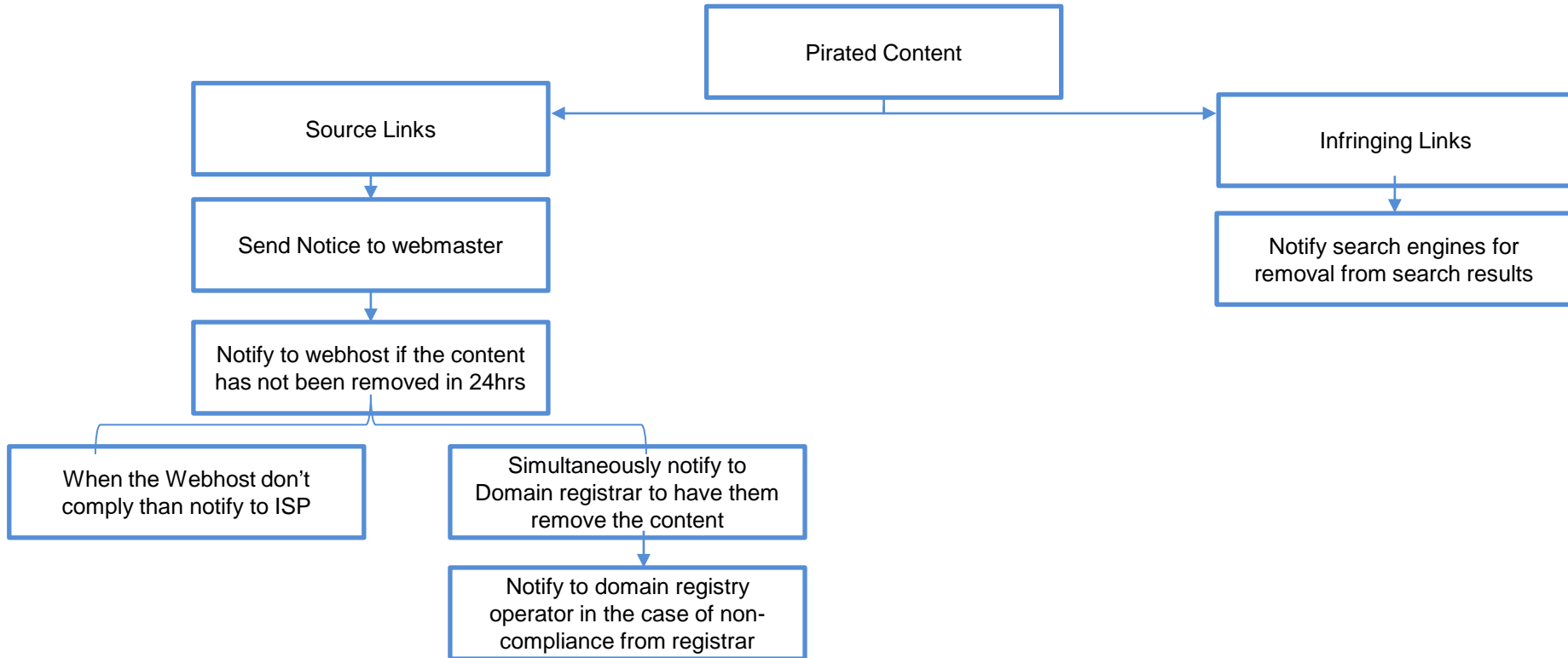


Current Scenario of Ebooks

- Low visibility of legitimate content, due to high volume of illegitimate content
- People get ebooks for free from these illegitimate channel which leads to less revenue.
- Less difference in pricing of physical book and Ebook.
- No anti-piracy efforts are being conducted by Indian publishers

Note: ~10 legitimate websites are available compared to 535 illegitimate websites identified following our detection efforts

Removal of pirated media and infringing search results, reduce overall accessibility to pirated content



Note: To ensure compliance from websites and intermediaries, as part of above exercise, our legal analysts research the applicable laws & past judgments from the respective jurisdictions to identify enforcement opportunities.

For the remaining non-compliant websites legal recourses are available. Below are the some recent case studies.

- Feb, 2015: To protect its copyrights in the film "Mango", MSM sought a restraining order against the release of "Badmashiyaan". This order required all publicity material to be taken offline. MarkScan ensured compliance of the Hon'ble court's order through followups with the internet ecosystem
- Jun, 2014: MSM, for FIFA World Cup 2014 sought a court injunction to block all the non-compliant websites (219) in India. MarkScan provided extensive litigation support in this matter.
- Apr, 2014: For the movie Youngistaan, MarkScan filed a complaint with the Latvian Police, against Lattelecom (Latvia's national telecom company), to take down a non-compliant site hosting pirated copies of the movie
- Mar, 2014: For the movie Queen, MarkScan filed a complaint, on behalf of Viacom 18, with the Swedish Economic Offences Department to take down content from hostingbulk.com
